To reassure families I can inform you that we are following guidance form Cheshire East and the UK Health Security Agency who have written to all schools. In line with their advice, children should come to school as normal. If your child has symptoms, which include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting, then the advice is that you use your judgement as a parent and contact your GP if you feel it is the best course of action. At school, we are ensuring surfaces are cleaned regularly, that classrooms are ventilated and that good hand hygiene is followed. If you have any questions, concerns or need advice you may contact our office who can signpost you to further information.
