They have recorded their work using the + and = signs and listened to stories about numbers 6,7 and 8, such as 'Six Dinner Sid' and 'Kipper's Toybox'. The weather was fine for another great forest school session. The children were given time to create their own activities based on all the things they have done before. They were building, collecting, hiding and exploring with their friends which was lovely to see. The PE session was fun. The children pretended to be a car. They had to travel round a roundabout, over the speed bumps and even go into reverse. They also played a 'tag' game using the tag rugby bands which they absolutely loved. Everyone was hot and sweaty by the time the game finished - including the teachers! Next week, they will meet a rather mischievous bus as they continue the 'journey' theme.


