We will be responding to the below suggestions for change in due course.

- ♦ Nothing (11 parents used this comment or a similar one)
- No shoes in the classroom; children have a place to put their shoes with their coats
- No more nits. More help and advice
- More policing around school for safety (i.e. parking and vehicles, smoking and animals)
- More structured homework regarding maths and English. Like new homework structure but feel these main subjects need a set piece per week as well
- How dinner time is watched
- ♦ More staggered pick up times
- New homework is too intense; they are more like weekly projects than the old maths, English, etc. people have busy lives and most of these homework projects are too much and very time consuming
- Not as much homework; I believe that there is too much homework for the timeframe given
- Can be very difficult to fit in homework with more than 1 child in school
- Text advising parents what letters have gone home in case they get lost or mislaid
- New homework scheme is disappointing; there seems to be little effort given to the subject content and it appears as a 'how many challenges can we make out of the subject'
- Something needs to be done regards to the policy of the whole school leaving via one gate at the end of the day



- ♦ Feel the homework project set does not teach the children anything
- Struggle to get my child motivated to complete the homework tasks, but reading and spellings they enjoy
- ♦ Maths homework and handwriting homework practice
- ♥ Behaviour issues (swearing)
- More support for children who are hitting the target/age related expectations (ARE)
- Upset that jackets and cardigans with names are going missing
- ♥ Behaviour
