<u>Geography</u> We will be locating the countries around the world and looking at the continents that they are in.

Europe is the continent we live in.

Environmental features can vary within a continent.

<u>Science</u> We will be learning about forces this half term.

Key Knowledge

A force is a push or a pull.

When an object moves on a surface, the texture of the surface and the object affect how it moves. It may help the object to move better or it may hinder its movement e.g. ice skater compared to walking on ice in normal shoes.

For some forces to act, there must be contact e.g. a hand opening a door, the wind pushing the trees. Some forces can act at a distance e.g. magnetism. The magnet does not need to touch the object that it attracts.

A magnet attracts magnetic material. Iron and nickel and other materials containing these, e.g. stainless steel, are magnetic.

Other relevant information for this half term

English—This term we will be exploring the exciting story of 'Ug' by Raymond Briggs and using it to inspire our own descriptive and narrative writing.

<u>Spelling</u>— It is vital that children learn the year 3/4 statutory spellings and know the spelling rules associated with these words to apply to new and unfamiliar spellings.
