Geography Key Vocabulary This half term in geography we will be exploring human and physical features and Ocean using these to describe similarities and differences between our local area and a Non-European country. Coast Vegetation Key Knowledge Valley Oceans, coasts and vegetation (plants) are examples of physical features. Port Ports, harbours and canals are examples of human features. Harbour Canal Science Key Vocabulary In science this half term we are learning all about living things and their habitats. Living Dead We will be looking at the difference between dead, alive or never been alive as never been alive well as searching for habitats, including microhabitats. suitable food chain Names of local habi-Key Knowledge tats e.g. pond, wood-All objects are either living, dead or have never been alive. Living things are plants (including seeds) and animals. Dead things include dead animals and plants and parts of land etc. plants and animals that are no longer attached e.g. leaves and twigs, shells, fur, hair and feathers. An object made of wood is classed as dead. Objects made of rock, metal and Names of microplastic have never been alive. habitats e.g. under Animals and plants live in a habitat to which they are suited, which means that animals logs, in bushes have suitable features that help them move and find food and plants have suitable features that help them to grow well. The habitat provides the basic needs of the animals and plants - shelter, food and water. Within a habitat there are different micro-habitats e.g. in a woodland - in the leaf litter, on the bark of trees, on the leaves. These micro-habitats have different conditions e.g. light or dark, damp or dry. These conditions affect which plants and animals live there. Key Vocabulary Art In art this half term we will be exploring the term 'mixed media' and using different media to Mixed media create our own "Tree of Life" inspired by the artist Gustav Klint. Medium Key Knowledge Media Mixed media is a term used to describe artworks composed from a combination of different media or materials. Key Vocabulary Music In music this half term, we will be learning some African call and response songs and then comtimbre posing our own. tempo rhythm Key Knowledge A call is sung first and a response after. dynamics Dynamics can change the effect a sound has on the audience. call and response The long and short sounds of a spoken phrase can be represented by a rhythm. Structure means the organisation of sound within music. structure The tempo of a musical phrase can be changed to achieve a different effect.

Computing In computing this half term we are looking at different way to present ideas using technology. We will explore E-Books, concept maps and quizzes and then present a story to the class using one of the chosen formats.	<u>Key Vocabulary</u> Presentation Fact Fiction
<u>Key Knowledge</u> An E-Book is an electronic version of a printed book that can be read on a comput- er or a specifically designed handheld device. A mind map is a tool for organizing and representing knowledge. A presentation is a way of displaying information about a subject to an audience.	Non-fiction E-Book Node Mind map
PSHE This half term in PSHE we will be looking at what things are private and what private means as well as how to respond if physical contact makes them feel uncomfortable.	<u>Key Vocabulary</u> Private Uncomfortable
<u>Key Knowledge</u> Private mean something belongs only to you. Parts of the body covered by underwear are private. You must tell someone if something makes you feel uncomfortable.	
<u>RE</u> This half term we are learning all about the sacred spaces in Judaism.	<u>Key Vocabulary</u> Shabbat Rabbi
<u>Key Knowledge</u> A synagogue is where Jewish people come to pray, study the Torah, and come to- gether for events. Shabbat is the Jewish Day of Rest.	

Other relevant information for this half term

<u>English</u>—This half term, we are reading and retelling 'Lila and the secret of rain', 'Goldilocks and just the one bear' and 'The bear and the piano'.

<u>Spelling</u>— It is vital that children learn the year 2 common exception words and know the spelling rules associated with these words to apply to new and unfamiliar spellings. We will study these spellings at school and those with similar spelling rules and letter patterns in both spelling and handwriting lessons. <u>Reading</u>- We cannot stress enough that children need to read and have their reading diaries signed 5 times a week. Children who don't read at home may need to stay in at breaktime to read with an adult.

<u>Maths</u>— We are starting to look at fractions this half term. You could continue to practice your times tables on Times Tables Rock Stars!

<u>PE</u>—Our PE topic is 'athletics'. PE this half term will be in a Wednesday, but the children must have their full PE kits available in school every day.

<u>DT</u>—Our DT project is based on structures. We will spend our time making a stable structure for Baby Bear to sit on.
