EYFS News

The children have been learning about festivals and celebrations this week: Divali and Guy Fawkes night.

They have been learning some Indian dance moves, listened to and discussed the story of Rama and Sita, learned about Diva lamps and rangoli patterns and found out how Hindus celebrate this important festival of lights. In maths, the children have been learning to recognise amounts to 3, say the total without needing to count the objects and also say 'what they can see' e.g. I can see 2 and 1 (3). This is called subitising and it is a vital early maths skill. Don't forget that our Stay and Play Maths session is coming up next week if you would like to learn more!
