EYFS News

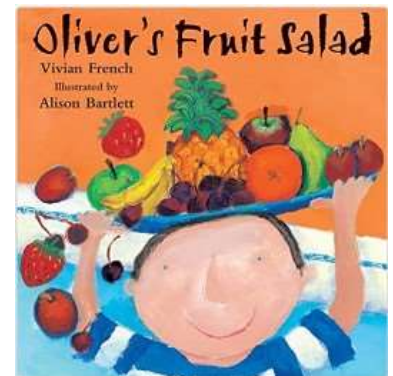
It has been all about the Coronation on Friday in the EYFS!
