## Holidays during term time

Holidays during term time are not permitted. The 2013 regulation amendments makes it clear that a headteacher may NOT grant any leave of absence (holiday) during term time unless there are 'exceptional circumstances'. The amendments give parents NO entitlement to take their child out of school for a holiday in term time.

If you are planning on taking your child/ren out of school during term time for a holiday or exceptional circumstances you will need to complete a leave of absence request form. This can be found on the school website or obtained from the school office. This form needs to be submitted at least TWO weeks before the planned absence wherever possible.

Parents/carers should be aware that 10 or more unauthorised absence marks (five days) over 2 consecutive half terms may lead to a fixed penalty notice of £60 per parent per child being issued by the local authority.
