### Uniform Policy Reminder

Although it is nearing the end of the year please adhere to our uniform policy. Children should wear:  
Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan  
Dark grey or black trousers/skirt/pinafore dress/tailored knee length shorts  
White polo shirt (no formal shirts)  
Blue check summer dress (optional)  
Socks must be plain in white, black or grey  
Tights must be plain grey or black, woollen style only  
Children should wear sensible plain black shoes (no platforms, boots, open toed or trainers)  
Discrete headbands and hair bobbles etc are acceptable.

Nail polish and jewellery is not part of the school uniform and therefore should not be worn at school. A plain, stud earring is permitted but these should be removed or covered for PE.

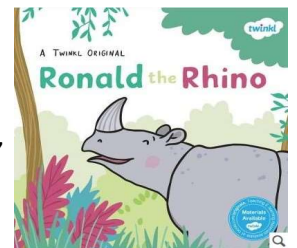
## Merits
