EYFS news

What wonderful weather we have had to finish the spring term! Everyone in the EYFS has enjoyed getting outside and making the most of the sunshine.

Reception children have been learning more about Spring, writing descriptive sentences using adjectives and learning more about signs of spring we see around us. Maths work has been about numbers 11,12 and 13 and adding on to number 10. Our trip to Delamere forest will consolidate this learning as the children go for a nature walk, make 'nature crowns' and take part in an Easter egg hunt! We hope you like the Easter cards the children have made.

Pre school children have been taking part in recap activities during their maths work. They have revisited subitising, comparing amounts, pattern, positional language and counting. They have enjoyed creating Easter cards and have been trying hard to form the letters in their name correctly. Rhyme time has been 'Round and Round the Garden,' which the children have really enjoyed singing in lots of different ways - fast, slow, loud and quiet! They have been reading 'We're going on an Egg Hunt'.
