### **EYFS** news

The reception children have been learning how to match, sort and compare this week in maths sessions. They have enjoyed a story called 'The Button Box' and have been learning how to use language to describe similarities and differences. They have also enjoyed listening to 'The Family Book' by Todd Parr and discussing families showing good understanding of how everyone's family is different. The weather was on side this week and the children went to the Forest School to collect leaves and make families of leaves which match. We hope they are all enjoying bringing home a reading book. Please send this back to school every day in the protective wallet and record your reading time with your child in the yellow diary. (PLEASE DO NOT PUT DRINK BOTTLES IN BOOK BAGS; IF A BOOK IS DAMAGED IT WILL COST £5 TO REPLACE). We are holding a reading information meeting for reception parents on Tuesday 7th October at 6.00pm.

Pre school children have enjoyed a lovely story called 'I Love You Blue Kangaroo' and talked about who they love, which is their favourite toy and discussed the feeling of the characters in the story. Maths work has focussed on early counting skills and saying number names in the correct order. They have sung 1,2,3,4,5 Once I caught a fish alive and 1,2, Buckle my shoe to help them say the number names in order. They enjoyed making a necklace with the leaves they gathered in Forest School. They had to count out 5 leaves and thread them onto the string.

Nursery children also enjoyed gathering leaves at Forest School and making a necklace. Threading skills are a very important first step towards writing when the children are ready. They have been singing 'I have 10 little fingers' and being creative with the colours blue and white.

We still have a number of children bringing clothes to school which have not been named. Please write your child's name in all items of clothing, water bottles and lunchboxes. If you need to borrow a permanent marker to do this, please let the staff know. Thank you.
