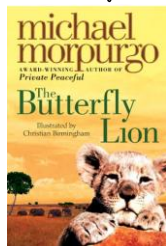

Science We will be learning about sound this half term - A sound produces vibrations which travels through a medium from the source to our ears. - Different mediums such as solids, liquids and gases can carry sound, but sound cannot travel through a vacuum. - Vibrations cause parts of our body inside our ears to vibrate, allowing us to hear the sound. - The loudness (volume) of the sound depends on the strength (size) of vibrations which decreases as they travel through a medium. - Sounds decrease in volume as you move away from the source. - A sound insulator is a material which blocks sound effectively. - Pitch is the highness or lowness of a sound and is affected by features of objects producing the sound e.g. smaller objects usually make a higher pitched sound. Computing We will be learning about how to keep safe online - Children can protect themselves from online identity theft. - Information put online leaves a digital footprint or trail and that this can aid identity theft. - Copying the work of others and presenting it as their own is called 'plagiarism'. - Easter eggs are an unexpected or undocumented feature in a piece of computer software or on a DVD, included as a joke or a bonus. 'Key words' are a word or a group of words an internet user uses to perform a search in a search engine. - The ancient Egyptian civilization began in approximately 3000 BC. - All early civilizations started life near rivers. Water provided everything that they would need: fertile soil to grow crops, fish to eat, transport, water to drink etc. They farmed the land and invented systems to help them e.g., the shaduf. - Writing, pictures and archaeology sites support the study of Ancient Egypt. - The most powerful person in Ancient Egypt was the pharaoh. - The pharaoh was the political and religious leader of the Egyptian people. - Howard Carter discovered Tutankhamun's tomb. - Religion impacted every aspect of life because people believed that their lives related directly to the gods. - The Ancient Egyptians had many significant achievements including mummification, language, farming and irrigation. Art We will be learning about printing - Incised printing is taking away the surface with an appropriate tool (finger, stick, pencil, end of paintbrush etc), applying colour and taking a print from this surface (press print, clay, plasticine). - The cut away area will not pick up the colour. D.T. Music In year 3 we will be learning about Samba music and Carnival sounds. - Samba music originated in Brazil, South America and its main musical feature is syncopated rhythms. - The 'on-beat' is the pulse of piece of music, and the 'off-beat' falls in between these. - A rhythmic break is a place in music where some of the instruments play a new rhythm before going back to the original rhythms. In year 4 we will be learning how to play the ukulele. There will be a small concert at the end of the 12-week block to showcase our learning.
