 A sound produces vibrations which travels through a medium 	Vibrate
from the source to our ears.	Vibration
 Different mediums such as solids, liquids and gases can carry sound, but sound cannot travel through a vacuum. Vibrations cause parts of our body inside our ears to vibrate, allowing us to hear the sound. The loudness (volume) of the sound depends on the strength (size) of vibrations which decreases as they travel through a medium. Sounds decrease in volume as you move away from the source. A sound insulator is a material which blocks sound effectively. Pitch is the highness or lowness of a sound and is affected by 	Travel Pitch (high, low) Volume Faint Loud Insulation
features of objects producing the sound e.g. smaller objects usually make a higher pitched sound.
