Science We will be learning about electricity this half term - Many household devices and appliances run on electricity. Some plug in to the mains and others run on batteries. - An electrical circuit consists of a cell or battery connected to a component using wires. - If there is a break in the circuit, a loose connection or a short circuit, the component will not work. - A switch can be added to the circuit to turn the component on and off. - Metals are good conductors so they can be used as wires in a circuit. - Non-metallic solids are insulators except for graphite (pencil lead). - Water, if not completely pure, also conducts electricity. Computing We will be learning about how to use code to control - Logo is a text-based coding language used to control an on-screen turtle to create mathematical patterns. - There is a structure when using the coding language of Logo. - Simple instructions are inputted in Logo. - Debugging is the process of identifying and removing errors from computer hardware or software. - LOGO Commands (e.g FD, BK, RT, LT) A list of commands inputted into 2Logo to move the turtle around the screen.
