The seven continents are: Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Australia. <p>Science Our learning this half term will be about every day materials. All objects are made of one or more materials that are chosen specifically because they have suitable properties for the task. When choosing what to make an object from, the properties needed are compared with the properties of the possible materials, identified through simple tests and classifying activities. A material can be suitable for different purposes and an object can be made of different materials. <p>Art We will be exploring the work of Hokusai and working in his style. Katsushika Hokusai was known simply as Hokusai. Hokusai was a painter and printmaker. He is best known for his woodblock print series called Thirty-six views of Mount Fuji which includes The Great Wave off Kanagawa. I can use a viewfinder to look closely at a part of a piece of artwork. I can create an image on a printing tile using pencils and other different tools. I can add colours to the tile and print onto different papers. <p>Computing Computing is a unit on questioning this half term. Data can be used to help answer a question. We will ask an appropriate question, gather data using a tally chart and present it using digital tools.</p>	<p>Data Tally Question Branching database</p>
